Saint Cecilia's is a co-educational secondary academy school for children aged 11-18 years old, specialising in the teaching of Music and Mathematics. We are a highly successful and well-respected school with a proven record of high academic standards taught in a caring, supportive and distinctly Christian environment. We currently have 750 pupils enrolled in Years 7-11 and approximately 200 students attending our thriving Sixth Form.

We continue to be one of the highest performing schools in the London Borough of Wandsworth. In 2018/19, our Attainment 8 score was 51.4. Moreover, in 2019, 83% of our pupils achieved 9-4 grades in English and 78% achieved 9-4 grades in Maths. Twenty-six per cent of A level grades were A*- A, and every year leavers gain places at prestigious Russell Group universities, including Oxbridge.

We are a very inclusive, friendly and dynamic place to work. Our dedicated team of teachers and support staff have been instrumental in shaping the lives of the children enrolled here and the successes we have achieved as a learning community.

The school aims and ethos

At Saint Cecilia's we believe that pupils should enjoy and learn from their everyday experiences, both in and out of school, valuing their school days as part of a process of lifelong learning. Fulfilment grows from a sense of personal achievement and pupils are given the opportunity to participate in a wide range of educational and recreational activities, including decision-making.

Teaching is organised to enable pupils to work individually as well as in groups, cooperatively and competitively. Assessment of pupils' work accentuates positive achievement and provides direction for future improvement.

As a Christian school, we are proud to declare that we exist to 'Glorify God through outstanding, enjoyable education'. We have collective worship at the end of every day and throughout the year we have parent and staff prayer meetings in school. Key dates of the Christian calendar are celebrated by our Communion in the Community events. Pupils, students and staff visit local churches to learn more about them and to experience a Communion Service.

Main school curriculum Key Stage 3 (Years 7 - 9)

Pupils have lessons in all National Curriculum subjects: Music, English, Mathematics, Science Physical Education, History, Drama, Geography, Religious Studies, Art and Design and PSHE. One Modern Foreign Language (French or Spanish) is taught in Years 7, 8 and 9. Homework is set regularly in each subject and parents can monitor their child's private study via the 'Show My Homework' website. At the end of Year 9, pupils select their GCSE choices.

Key Stage 4 (Years 10 - 11)

Pupils are encouraged to study a range of subjects within a broad and balanced curriculum at Key Stage 4. All pupils will follow a compulsory core of subjects: English, Mathematics, Science (Double/Triple), Religious Studies, Physical Education (non-examined) and PSHE (non-examined). Pupils choose from an exciting range of optional GCSE/BTEC subjects, including: Art and Design, Business Studies, Computer Science, Drama, French, Geography, History, Music, Physical Education, Spanish and Textiles.

Provision for High Attaining pupils

National expectations for the high attainers are that they achieve at least Grades 6-9 (B grade equivalent) in all subjects at GCSE. However, at Saint Cecilia's it is expected that these pupils achieve at least 7-9 Grades (A*/A equivalent) in all subjects. Those who are identified as High Attaining pupils (based on KS2 test results) are given further challenge in lessons, through differentiated work, higher order questioning or more independent tasks. All pupils in school are also provided with challenging and thought-provoking lessons and activities to give them the opportunity to develop their academic strengths.

Pupils who display a particular strength within a subject area are also identified by departments as being more able. Pupils may be added or removed from these lists throughout the year. Teachers provide for

these pupils through further challenge in lessons and may provide additional experiences outside of lessons, with visits and trips to places of interest to help pupils develop their passion and academic strengths in the subject.



Provision for pupils with Special Educational Needs

We offer a range of provisions to support children with communication and interaction, cognition and learning difficulties, social or health problems or sensory or physical needs. Pupils are screened at the beginning of Year 7 and staff have access to measures of attainment such as their Key Stage 2 National Curriculum Test scores. This information is used to determine whether a child has special educational needs and the support that is needed, whether this is in class or through additional support outside the classroom.

Progress continues to be monitored and tracked during their time at Saint Cecilia's. The 'Bethany Centre' in school also provides pupils with one-to-one support and strategies to resolve any learning barriers.

Extra-curricular clubs, trips, sports and houses

Every term, pupils are offered a wide range of diverse extra-curricular clubs. Attendance to at least two extra-curricular clubs per week is compulsory and all pupils are encouraged to find something of interest. Clubs on offer to pupils includes Netball, Football (girls and boys), Science, Revision and various music clubs. Regular educational trips take place in the UK and abroad and include trips to West End theatres and London museums, Spain, Austria, Italy, USA and France. Pupils are also encouraged to take the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and the school has many links with top universities to provide pupils with a first-hand experience of higher education. The Music department organises a yearly music tour abroad - in July 2018 the pupils spent five days in Malta.

The school has strong rugby, netball, athletics and football teams which successfully take part in weekly local and regional competitions. Our annual Sports Day takes place at Wimbledon Athletics track. Our Sixth Form boys can benefit from joining the Saint Cecilia's Rugby Academy with our partners, Premiership Rugby Club, London Irish. Students can study with us whilst playing and training with professional London Irish coaches.

Our netball teams have won Wandsworth Borough competitions for a number of years and have three teams or more in each age group. Every year, our athletics teams successfully represent the Wandsworth borough at the prestigious London Games. In May 2018 they secured 11 gold medals at the Wandsworth Inter-Schools athletics tournament. We also have strong links with the Wimbledon Tennis Championships and a number of pupils are selected as ball boys or girls.

The House system embodies the school's ethos and values. The six Houses (Schubert, Archimedes, Ives, Newton, Turing and Carter) support different charities and regularly take part in sporting, volunteering and other events, including an annual charity run in Wimbledon Park.



The School Day

The school day starts at 8.50am. Pupils/students have a short break of 20 minutes and a 40-minute lunch break every day. Lessons are divided into five periods of one hour. The school day ends with an assembly or mentor meeting. Pupils are expected to attend at least two extra-curricular, enrichment or revision clubs per week. In order to gain maximum curriculum flexibility, the school adopts a two-week timetable. The two weeks within the ten-day cycle are called Week A and Week B.

Every year, both departments consistently achieve excellent examination results at GCSE and A Level. Saint Cecilia's is also a Secondary Beacon School for the London South West Maths Hub and regularly showcase the Maths Mastery Style of teaching. This involves regular Maths Open Days in which staff from other schools come and observe best practice in this field.

The School's unique combination of Music and Mathematics specialism with a caring Christian community gives pupils the best opportunities to succeed both academically and socially, supporting all areas of the curriculum.

Communication with parents/carers


At Saint Cecilia's we assign particular importance to contact with parents/carers. School reports are sent via post to parents/carers three times a year. Parents' evenings take place once a year for each year group. Mentors are the first point of contact for parents/carers and they are welcome to meet/email them with any queries.



Private Study (homework)

Teachers set private study for pupils on a regular basis. Saint Cecilia's uses 'Show My Homework' for private study, a simple 24/7 online homework calendar showing homework information, deadlines and resources for pupils.

Parents/carers can review deadlines and monitor homework.



Behaviour and Pastoral Care

At Saint Cecilia's, we seek to maintain a clear set of appropriate and robust boundaries and encourage all pupils to behave in an appropriate way, according to biblical values, in order to facilitate learning and help pupils develop spiritually, morally, socially and culturally.

To facilitate effective learning and ensure high achievement we seek to:

- Establish clear boundaries, ensuring good order within a safe and secure environment.
- o Develop good relationships that promote respect, worth and belonging.
- Provide constructive feedback to pupils and students in relation to learning and conduct and provide a 'way back' if things go wrong.

We have a central conduct system which allows teachers and support staff to record positive and negative behaviours in school.

The strong pastoral system at Saint Cecilia's ensures that pupils have as few barriers to learning as possible. Mentors play a crucial role in all pupils' social and academic development.

Mentors develop a close and trusting relationship with pupils and their parents, acting as the first point of contact where possible. Mentor groups meet regularly and take part in assemblies and trips.

Bullying is completely against our Christian ethos and will not be tolerated at Saint Cecilia's.

- Pupils are encouraged to identify and report any concerns to a member of staff.
 There is an anti-bullying box in the Chapel which is emptied daily.
- o Incidents are investigated and, where appropriate, acted upon. Records are kept up to date to help identify those involved.

Our 'Bethany Centre' accommodates all aspects of support and inclusion ensuring we meet the needs of all pupils including those with Special Education Needs, those who speak English as an additional language and those with personal struggles such as bereavement. We also have a school Chapel which is open at all times and our school Chaplain organises regular opportunities for prayer.



Information Management

Saint Cecilia's uses the Schools Information Management System (SIMS) to record all activity relating to pupils and students. Staff keep records updated with information regarding attendance, behaviour, sanctions, medical details and contact information. We use SIMS In-Touch to communicate with parents, who are asked to download the SIMS Parent App to receive messages and access timetable information. We also use SIMS to keep staff records.

Accelerated Reader

Every child in Year 7 is registered onto the 'Accelerated Reader' system. This computer package allows us to track pupil reading ages and help them to improve their literacy skills. Studies show that regular readers progress more quickly in every subject at school, so we encourage pupils to read for pleasure and to read regularly.

Children in Year 7 are given a username and password and shown how to access 'Accelerated Reader' on the school computers so that they can check that they are reading at the right level, choose books that will help to stretch their reading ability and complete quizzes on the books that they have read. Every time they complete a book quiz, the system records how many words were in the book and keeps a tally of the number of words that they have read in total. Once a child has read one million words, they receive a prize and house points, plus a special 'Word Millionaire' badge to wear on their blazer.

Our Library

The Library at Saint Cecilia's is a busy and essential resource which receives around 50,000 visits per academic year. With over 5,000 books, a selection of magazines and a set of laptops for use within the Library, we have something to offer pupils and students from all year groups. We have an excellent range of fiction books, from the classics to the latest best-selling novels and graphic novels. Our non-fiction collection covers curriculum subjects and topics of general interest and is regularly updated.

The Library software, Accessit, allows pupils and students to search the catalogue, renew items, write reviews and more, whether in school or at home, using their school sign-in information. All pupils, students and staff are automatically members of the Library, and Year 7 attend an induction session in September where they learn what we offer and our procedures. This includes using their school photo card to borrow books, learning how to search the catalogue for resources or to see when their books are due for return. Trained staff offer support to pupils, from helping with research, to suggesting books based on previous reading choices.

Throughout the year, diverse activities take place to help foster an enjoyment of reading: book clubs, competitions, sponsored reading for charity, trips and author visits. We also mark annual events such as Holocaust Memorial Day and Anti-bullying Week with displays to engage and educate visitors. Visits by mentor groups and English classes at Key Stage 3 ensure children engage with books in pleasant surroundings. From Year 8, pupils are welcome to apply to become Pupil Librarians. This is a fun and educational position that teaches teamwork, organisation and responsibility. Our Pupil Librarians play a very important role within the Library.
