

Sixth Form Business Studies students are studying Business Finance as part of their course. To help them understand how businesses make money from investing in shares, they took part in a share challenge. Each student was given a 'pretend' sum of money - £20,000. They had to choose one business that they would use this money to buy shares in. Each student researched a company, found out the share price and worked out how many shares they could buy for their money.

The students all put in £1 to the game to take part, which went towards the prize fund of £30. They then tracked their share price over the course of a month, the winner being the person who made the most money on their investment.




