I also know that Renata Joseph is filled with anticipation for new things this year and will be sharing this in assemblies over the next couple of weeks.



Showcasing what we do best



Those selected for the Netball Squad in the 2022-23 season will receive an exciting raft of benefits including:


- Coaching by Surrey Storm Superleague players three times a week
