Message from the Headteacher

'Everything is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ Jesus and has given us the work of reconciling others to Him'

2 Corinthians 5:18



Last week, I was inspired by British racing driver Nicholas Hamilton (brother of Sir Lewis Hamilton) who spoke at the ASCL Headteachers' conference, about being a disabled young person in a mainstream school. He shared stories about his early attempts to fit in, and how he learnt to be himself and be proud of who he is. As I listened to him, it reminded me of how much pressure many of our

young people are under at this time, and the need to keep reminding them they are valued for who they are. This will be a theme in my message for all pupils and students, when we meet at the end of term, for Easter collective worship.

We have had a tremendous response to the Ukrainian appeal from pupils and students, so thank you. Donations will be delivered to the Polish Cultural Centre next week, and will be on their way to the Polish-Ukrainian border shortly after. We will continue to look for opportunities to offer humanitarian help wherever we can.

Many congratulations to a number of pupils this week.

Heloise and **Macaulay** in Year 10, took part in the Jack Petchey 'Speak Out' Challenge. Heloise went on to win the Wandsworth final and progresses to the Regional finals. This is an amazing achievement, which places Heloise in the top 0.2% of young public speakers in London and Essex! We are incredibly proud to have 13 pupils making it through to the final selection process for Ball Boys and Girls, for the 2022 Wimbledon Championships. Well done to Alex, Amy, Archie, Arthur, Barnabas, Charlie, George, Jacob, Jade, Louis, Maximus, Raphaela and Robin.

Finally, pupils and students in examination year groups begin their second window of assessments, as part of the contingency plan, in the event exams are cancelled because of COVID-19. Although it is unlikely, the DfE have not changed their policy, so it is crucial these assessments go ahead. Teachers will do all they can to lessen the worry and stress assessments can cause, but do speak to your child's mentor if you think we can do more to support. Cathy Bull has invited Year 11 parents to school for a coffee morning to discuss overcoming exam anxiety, which we hope will be helpful. Do look out for the invitation later in the newsletter.



Ecology studies


