Chaplain's Corner

'Dishonest wealth will dwindle, but what is earned through hard work will be multiplied' Proverbs 13:11

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this find you well and you had a good bank holiday weekend. This week at school we were talking about money more specifically, wisdom for finances.

The Bible warns about the very real temptation to make money through dishonest means. Even if you do, it will dwindle away! We've tried to be clear on this with pupils and students by emphasising that those who make money in illicit ways won't be able to enjoy it. They will never have peace of mind or a clear conscience. Money can't buy peace or happiness!

However, we've also tried to be clear that having money or being rich is not a bad thing. The verse goes on to say, 'what is earned through hard work will be multiplied.' Our message has been that hard work starts now if you want to lay good foundations for your future.

Another verse in Proverbs says, 'A good name [earned by honourable behaviour, godly wisdom, moral courage, and personal integrity] is more desirable than great *riches'* (Proverbs 22:1). Therefore, the challenge also remains for all of us to think about whether we are making choices that will lead to a good name in future, or making choices that are short-sighted with only temporary rewards.

I hope you will be encouraged to pick up on these themes for discussion with your child whenever you get a chance.




Local Schools Enjoy Science Experience Days

Year 7 and 8 Amazing Athletes


