Book Fest Trip

Last Friday a group of pupils and students from Years 8-13 visited Wimbledon BookFest on Wimbledon Common.

They had been selected by Susie Derby, our Librarian, and the English department, and included pupils whose submissions to the Young Writers' competition had been highly commended and are thus included in the 2021 anthology, 'My Name Is'.

We were treated to a truly engaging presentation from the author Michelle Paver, about her research for the latest title in her Wolf Brother series, 'Skin Taker'. This series follows the characters Torak, Renn and Wolf on their adventures in the Stone Age world.

Regaling us with tales of, and artefacts from, her own Arctic adventures, Michelle taught us about different uses for reindeer antler: from a weapon, to needles and even snow goggles! We learnt how the indigenous people use every last piece of a seal's body so that nothing is wasted, and how best to approach a wolf, should we ever find ourselves in that situation!

Michelle took time to answer questions from the floor about her books and the writing process, and held the audience captivated throughout her talk.

After this, the winners and runners-up in the Young Writers'

competition were awarded their prizes and we were able to hear the poem which won the overall prize for 2021. 'My Name is 2020' is a powerful piece that impressed many of our pupils. You can read this poem, and many other stories and poems, including those from some of our own pupils, in the anthology <u>here</u>.


Accessing Sports Fixtures


Jazz Joy

We are delighted to be able to share the news with you that one of our Year 13 leavers of 2021, **Ethan**, was offered a place to study jazz at the world-renowned Trinity Laban in London (Greenwich), after a challenging audition and interview process. The fact that this is the premier Jazz conservatoire underlines his remarkable achievement.

Ethan has already had some fantastic workshops and sessions with brilliant musicians, including his small band sessions. He has really enjoyed the interesting rhythm sessions, looking at Indian rhythms and other music from different cultures. Ethan is currently working on a Blues piece for one of his assignments. Interestingly, he is one of only four drummers in the first year, and one of very few musicians enrolled on the Jazz course. Ethan is particularly looking forward to a workshop with Femi Koleoso, drummer and bandleader for Ezra Collective, and performing with other musicians.

Ethan demonstrated great musical talent during his time at Saint Cecilia's, performing in many of our concerts and performances. We are delighted that he has chosen to continue to further his musical skills at Trinity Laban. Well done Ethan!
