It offered a reflective space to consider how exam stress impacts our children and also to consider some practical strategies to support them (as well as some excellent pastries!).

It was lovely to see so many parents face to face and we do hope to see many of you at future events.

Below are some websites that parents may find useful if your child finds exams particularly stressful, as well as two breathing exercises to help you or your child manage any type of stressful situation.

One minute stress-beaters



Progressive Muscle Relaxation

- Close your eyes and concentrate on your breathing
- Slowly breathe in through your nose, out through your mouth
- Make a fist, squeeze your hand tightly
- Hold the fist for a few seconds and notice the tension
- Slowly open your fingers and feel the difference. Notice the tension leaving
- Try with other parts of the body




