I am delighted to tell you that pupils raised a total of £967.85 for the Bishop's Lent Appeal and #TeamSeas. A huge proportion of that came from the fundraising efforts of Year 7, so well done for coming out in your house colours Year 7! All the money raised for the Bishop's Lent Appeal will be shared amongst the Bishop's homeless charities. Not to be out done by younger pupils, Head Girl and Head Boy, Lydia and Dereiss, led the Sixth Form through a week of fundraising for Ukraine. This included a charity netball match, debate, Growing the Biggest Sunflower competition, and 'wear yellow and blue' day. All proceeds will be donated to the NGO Sunflower of Peace, who are providing humanitarian relief and medical aid to Ukraine.

British Science Week: competition winners


