

Year 7 Geography Field Trip Reminder

As part of our Key Stage 3 Geography curriculum, all pupils are required undertake in fieldwork exercises during their first three years in secondary school. This important piece of work focuses on a variety of tasks around the school and local Southfields area to develop investigative skills. In addition to this, we are running a one-day field trip to the Southbank in central London to investigate the role of tourism there.

Pupils will be surveying the local area to investigate what tourist sites exist on the Southbank, and will quantify their popularity. This will require pupils to complete field sketches, count pedestrian flows, engage in questionnaires with tourists and undertake evaluative observations to help them to draw conclusions of tourism provision in London.

Each class will be going on a separate date as detailed below. I would be grateful if parents could check ParentPay for the relevant permission slips, which need to be completed and returned.
