One of the great benefits of working in education and with young people is the opportunity we have each year to have a new beginning; to be able to launch new strategies, tweak what we do well and build on it to make it even better.

We are excited to welcome new pupils and families, new colleagues and new governors, and to see the change to our buildings.

<u>A Level and GCSEs – A celebration of individual success</u>

Results for both A Levels and GCSEs are well positioned when compared to national results.

At A Level and Level 3 BTECs:

AUTUMN TERM

44.3% of grades achieved were A\*-A
71.2% of grades achieved were A\*-B
89.6% of grades achieved were A\*-C
78.0% of BTEC grades were Distinction\*-Merit

At GCSE:

Attainment 8 score is 55.37 compared to 53.4 in 2020 and 51.4 in 2019 83.0% of pupils achieved grades 9-4 in both English and Maths 58.5% achieved grades 9-5 in both English and Maths

The grades represent an overall improvement in results. Our young people have had to work harder, be more resilient and more focused than ever. With the support of their teachers and families, they have done tremendously well and should be congratulated for all they have achieved.

In Year 13, a large proportion of students won places to their first choice university to

study a wide range of subjects and disciplines. This included Zoe to study medicine at the University of Birmingham and Scout to study Veterinary Science at the University of Liverpool. I am equally delighted that so many progressed from our suite of BTEC subjects to universities across the country, where they will continue to aim high and achieve.

A number of students achieved A\*/A grades across all subjects at A Level: Basima, Halla, Wasil, Rebecca, Tomas, Eryn, Badger, Rudy, Felix, Joss, Scout, Grace, Caleb, Hector Price, Kim, Zoe, Ethan, Eve and Sophia.

In Year 11, the following pupils achieved a combination of 7s, 8s and 9s across all subjects: Jack, Ruby, Joel, Jake, Sebastian, Leo, Mackenzie, Helena, Jude, Natasha and Alex.

I am incredibly proud that the vast majority of pupils and students have progressed onto the next stage of their education.

#### Building Expansion – Phase 1 completed

The hugely anticipated handover of the new teaching block took place in August, ready to welcome additional pupils joining us in Year 7. The new teaching block includes new History, Science and Computing teaching rooms, as well as a staff training room and additional pupil toilets. Now, connected to the existing main building, the new block has formed a beautiful land-scaped quad, providing a quiet outdoor space for pupils and students to spend time at break. We look forward to welcoming the Archdeacon of Wandsworth, the venerable John Kiddle, to dedicate the new wing on 29th September. Plans are now underway with Wandsworth to begin Phase 2: the dining hall extension.

## **Eco Efforts**

As a school we are trying to make all aspects of the building and outside spaces as eco-friendly as we can and this will continue to be an on-going focus for us. The new classrooms achieve an 'A' rating for energy efficiency as they include solar panels, an air source heat pump (extracts warmth from the outside air to heat the classrooms), heat recovery ventilation systems, LED lighting and the latest control systems. We have received a Government grant for the main school building to add solar panels, an air source heat pump and to replace old internal lights with new LED fittings. The improvements should save £20,000 per year in energy costs and significantly reduce emissions.

We are improving our green space and have added bird boxes, bat boxes and bug hides to the 'green corridor'; the divide between the school and the neighbouring properties. A grassed courtyard has been created in the area where our temporary classrooms were located. We have over forty mature trees on site and will continue to plant new trees each year, so that younger trees will gradually mature to ensure a mixed (age and species) tree stock.
