Message from the Headteacher

At the end of last week, I left my Year 7 PSHE class, very moved by the understanding and compassion demonstrated by pupils, for both the Ukrainian and Russian people. We have kept both nations in our prayers, but now want to turn our attention to the practical support we might offer. In the coming week we will reach out to a local Polish cultural centre who we know is supporting Ukrainians refugees arriving in Poland. Do look out for a future update from Chaplain Shoderu, about how you can help us, to help others.

This week has been another busy one in our extra-curricular calendar, as Year 8 visited Hyde Park on a sustainability field trip, and Sixth Form students visited the theatre to see Hamilton and La Casa de Benarda Alba. I am grateful to staff for organising these events for pupils.

Dear Parents,

As we continue to study the theme of Reconciliation, let's continue to pray for God's peace for the people of Ukraine. We are going to be considering ways that we as a school can contribute to some of the practical needs of the people. Please keep an ear out for more on this.

We have looked in detail about reconciliation over the last week; through discussions at Christian Union and from the video series we've been watching in Year assemblies. I've been thinking about how we reconcile the ideas of God's love and God's justice. They can often seem like polar opposites, or we might sometimes think, 'I wish we could take God's love and leave out God's justice'. This week, I became more thankful for

both of these aspects of God's character. Thankful that His justice will mean that evil, war and death will not have the last laugh. Thankful that the wrong things in this world will be made right, and that "there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain..." (Revelation 21:4).

I'm thankful that God's love, demonstrated most clearly through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, means that there is a way for all of this to be accomplished. I'm thankful that God's love means that we too can be forgiven, when we've been the ones in the wrong.

Knowing this truth, about how God has done all He can to reconcile us to Himself, may we be proactive in seeing the things that are wrong in our world be made right.

The selection of photos were taken by two budding photographers in Year 9, **Joon In** and **Patrick** who are part of Film and Photography Club. Thank you both for your help.







Putney High Debate






