### Message from the Headteacher

I was thrilled that, following the disappointment of having to cancel the formal Presentation Evening, we were able to hold a Celebration Evening on Tuesday. Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are well. In our Collective Worship this week, we continued our Wisdom series with a focus on helping our pupils and students think wisely about their futures (very apt particularly for Year 11s and 13s).

Often anxiety about the future comes from feeling we need to have Plan A, B, C all the way to Z for our lives. The weight of expectation can sometimes come from within ourselves, from friends/family or from wider society. Wherever this expectation comes from, it can be a very heavy weight to carry. The question for them to think about is: what is a wise approach for thinking about the future as a teenager? Some principles were explored by Year Leaders and House Leaders, but ultimately a lot of it comes down to the daily choices they are making in the present.

Solomon, the writer of the verse above, encourages his readers to involve God in the process, rather than just go solo or 'lean on your own understanding.' Those who do involve God, will find that God 'makes your paths straight'.

I have been taking the opportunity, whenever it arises, to share key experiences that I've had with pupils and students, and I've been encouraging colleagues to do the same. My hope is that they will feel supported and guided whenever it comes to making important decisions. I was delighted when a Year 13 student asked me recently, "Sir, is there someone I can talk through some career options I've been thinking about?" Please pray for more of these type of conversations and for God's light to shine on the future paths of our pupils.




### Year 10 Model Scientists


Year 10 have been learning about the nervous system and enjoyed modelling neurones out of plasticine. Here are some pupils at work and their final models:







It is an Inter-House event so remind your child to have fun with their friends and encourage them to get as creative as possible! Also do remind them that there are prizes to be won!


